BADP

- 1. Border Area Development Programme was introduced in Arunachal Pradesh from the year 1997-98 initially for Indo-Myanmar Border of the State with an allocation of Rs.4.00 crores. From 1998-99 the programme was extended to the international borders of Indo-China (1126 Km) and Indo-Bhutan (217 Km) to meet the special needs of the people living in 1863 Km longborder areas of Arunachal Pradesh to remove the critical gaps in physical and social infrastructure needs and to strengthen the economic conditions and raise the standard of living amongst the inhabitants of the remote border areas of the State as per the guidelines of BADP. Presently BADP schemes are implemented in 46 (forty six) border blocks in 15 (fifteen) districts of the state which covers total 1944 villages and population of 390934 nos as per 2011 census report. The schemes are implemented with the main emphasis for infrastructural development of Education, Health, Agri & Allied Sectors. Sports and Skill Development.

3. However, in spite of all other difficulties special care has been taken at the State level for removing the gap of infrastructure at the border areas by selecting maximum proposals under BADP from the 'Infrastructure Sector' of which special care has been taken for providing connectivity in the border areas in a phased manner. - 3. Further, for development of educational facilities in the border areas proposals for Establishment of 4 nos. new Vivekananda Kendriya Vidyalaya (VKV) and Up-gradation of 4 nos exiasting VKVs were considered by MHA for an estimated cost of Rs.80.00 Cr against which Rs.20.00 Cr (Rs. 18.00+ Rs.2.00 Cr) and Rs.9.75 Cr (Rs.877.3111+Rs.97.48 lakh) has been released during 2017-18 & 2018-19 respectively as Central & State Share.
- 4. Although, the scheme is to be implemented to remove the critical gaps in physical and social infrastructural needs and to strengthen the economic conditions and raise the standard of living amongst the inhabitants of the remote border areas but even after completion of 20 years the achievement is far behind in comparison to other part of the border. It may not be out of point to mention here that Arunachal Pradesh did not inherit any infrastructure from the pre-Independence period. As such, common guidelines framed for any programmes for all the State without considering State specific aspects is one of the main reasons for lagging behind in comparison with the other states of the country. Therefore, a massive development thrust is the need of the hour for the rapid economic development of the border areas in particular and State as a whole.
